BY THE WATERSIDE WITH GEOFF HUNT

Our demonstrator for the May 27th members' meeting is Geoff Hunt PPRSMA and his subject is By the Waterside in Watercolours.

Geoff is well-known as a marine artist and is a member and Chairman of the Wapping Group.

He is also a member of the Royal Society of Marine Artists and a past President.

He says his basic plein-air painting philosophy is "to rush the job without adequate preparation and rely on luck, rage and sometimes self-harm to pull me through." This technique served him badly he says when he painted oils outdoors and has done even worse since 2013, when he switched to using water

RULES

Members may submit up to three works - framed pictures (maximum size 36"x24", 91 x 61mm) in any medium, box canvases or 3D pieces. We hope to hang or display all the exhibits entered.

Folios - up to three unframed pictures (sorry no canvas oils) can be mounted ready for framing and wrapped in cellophane for display in the racks.

Exhibits should be your own recent *original work* and not have been shown in any previous AAS exhibition. Collographs, monoprints, lino or woodcuts are welcome but please do not enter copies of other artists' work or prints of your own work. Some digital work will be permitted, ask for details.

All exhibits should be labelled on the back or the base with the Title, Artist's name, Medium and Price. (see below). Only one work may be Not For Sale. Make sure that the details on your picture match those on the entry form. Late entries cannot be accepted. 20% commission to AAS.

Up to 30 cards of members' artwork may be sold at £2.50 each. To fit into the racks, cards should be no bigger than 7" \times 5" (18 \times 12.5mm) and be individually wrapped in cellophane with name of artist either printed on the back of the card or on a sticky label on the back of the cellophane. 10% commission to AAS.



The Art Society does not provide insurance.

All framed pictures should look like this on the back! It aims to protect your work and the fabric-covered panels and helps the hanging team with their display.

NO clip frames for safety reasons.

Gummed paper/photographic tape NOT parcel tape.

D-rings (NOT screw eyes) one third of the way down frame.

Cord NOT wire, reasonably taut.

Adhesive label with title, name, medium and price as per your entry form, stuck firmly on the back.

Card label hanging from cord to below frame with same info.

AGM ROUND UP

The Chairman reported on an unusual and difficult year but links to art galleries around the world, along with ideas for videos, podcasts and TV programmes were circulated to keep members entertained.

Jenni Black had inspired a members' online exhibition and, as there was no actual exhibition, these lockdown paintings were put on the society's website instead.

Classes hit the buffers but in the next term, with a strict Covid regime, eight students were permitted to meet with a tutor. However the Friday class successfully moved online and stayed that way ever since.

March, April and May speakers were rescheduled to future programmes but some demonstrators fell by the wayside. Sharon Hurst was the first to embrace the technology, producing an immersive portrait video.

The postponed AGM was held in September. During the year Joel Wareing demonstrated figures in acrylics, Scott Anderson gave a fascinating insight into Gustav Klimt, while Alison Board laid on a Zoom demo using three cameras. Roger Dellar showed us how to handle light in a painting and Max Hale tackled drawing techniques.

Sue Cox organised two well received local Painting Days in the summer at Longwood and Cheriton Cottage.

We lost four members this year; lan MacIntosh, Paul Maxlow Tomlinson, Anne Hart and Ann Wadman. Bob Hart is supplying a new trophy in Anne's memory for the exhibition for the Best Floral or Botanical painting. Ann Wadman was a wonderful personality, a talented sculptor and a past chairman of the society.

Committee meetings had been held on Zoom throughout the pandemic The Chairman thanked the committee for all their work during the year and said goodbye and thank you to Vivienne Isemann and Jean Wheeler. Vivienne had been on the committee for ten years and for most of that time has been our excellent Membership Secretary.

The Treasurer explained that the curtailment of our activities as a result of the pandemic has had a significant impact on our income and expenditure during the year, with no exhibition, no workshops and a much reduced programme of classes. In spite of that, we have more than covered our costs and generated a small surplus of just over £150.


Our healthy balance provides a buffer against expenses that we face in the coming year, which includes the move of members' meetings to Bishop's Sutton Village Hall; the lack of subscription income following our decision to 'roll over' 2020/21 subscriptions to 2022, also some members had paid for classes which did not go ahead.

Graham Marsden was made a Vice President of the Society and Anne Lain and Mike Dudfield were elected to the committee. Veronica Bliss will take over as Membership Secretary.

Jonathan Newey is an award winning artist with over 25 years of experience in both drawing and painting. Born in Reading he comes from a long line of artists. He has extensive experience in a wide range of mediums and subject matter. He has over 20 years experience as a teacher and lecturer and has published numerous books on how to paint and draw animals and architecture. He is a member of The David Shepherd Wildlife Foundation and has been regularly selected for their 'Wildlife Artist of the Year' exhibiton at the Mall Galleries.
