WHAT A GUY

What a stunning demo we had from Chris Forsey!

He began his mixed media Spring by the River with a sheet of mount board coated in gesso. Next came a water-colour wash across the whole surface, followed by watered down acrylic for the river bank, helped along by a water spray.

Acrylic inks followed applied with a palette knife; pieces of card, smudged with fingers, sprayed from a toothbrush, even scratched with a finger nail and finally touches of oil pastels for highlights. All the time keeping up a steady stream of anecdotes, tips and good humour. What a guy!

International artist and author Soraya French will be tackling a Still Life in Mixed Media on Tuesday 29th October at the John Pearson Hall at 7.30pm.

She will follow up with a workshop on the 9th November and, as she has numerous fans in this society, make sure you book your place early.

Light and colour are the two important elements in her paintings, together with semi abstract passages with a sense of ambiguity.

Soraya has received a number of prestigious art awards for her paintings in recent years and many of them can be found in private and public collections both at home and abroad. A regular contributor to The Artist magazine, the success of her four art books has brought her international recognition. She is President of the Society of Women Artists

Trevor Waugh will be joining us on Tuesday 24th September at 7.30pm at the John Pearson Hall to demonstrate a Street Scene in Watercolour.

After graduating from The Slade School of Fine Art in the early 70s Trevor moved on to study illustration at Croydon College of Art where he obtained a distinction before embarking on a highly successful life as a freelance illustrator.

Now an internationally renowned and highly regarded British fine artist based in Wiltshire, his paintings can be found in many private and royal collections around the world.

His first loves were creative writing and painting and in 2004 published a series of graphic novels he wrote and had illustrated by award-winning artist Jeff Anderson.

In 2007 he started teacher training and teaches art and art history in several colleges in West Sussex. Since 2013 Steve has been travelling to Kolkata, India to teach art to children in slum schools. He continues to support and fundraise for the charity Pursuit International that assists young people in leaving compulsory education and starting their careers.
