*Order under Recreation Grounds

Bye-laws.*

CHARITY COMMISSION.

In the Matter of the Charity called Colonel STRATTON BATES'S RECREATION GROUND, in the Parish of NEW ALRESFORD, in the County of SOUTHAMPTON, comprised in a Scheme of the Charity Commissioners of the 9th January 1912;

In the Matter of "The Recreation Grounds Act, 1859"; and

In the Matter of "The Charitable Trusts Acts, 1853 to 1894."

The Board of Charity Commissioners for England and Wales, in execution of the provisions of section 6 of the Recreation Grounds Act, 1859:

Do hereby Declare their approval of the subjoined Bye-laws made by the Trustees of the above-mentioned Recreation Ground in pursuance of the provisions of the said Act.

BYE-LAWS MADE BY THE TRUSTEES OF COLONEL STRATTON BATES'S RECREATION GROUND WITH RESPECT TO THE SAID RECREATION GROUND.

(1) The Recreation Ground shall be open from the 1st April to the 30th September during the hours of 6 a.m. to 9 p.m., and from the 1st October to the 31st March during the hours of 8 a.m. to 5 p.m.

(2) The Trustees have the right of letting the ground for 12 days only in every year, on such conditions as they may from time to time deem expedient.

(3) The following acts are strictly prohibited:—

(a) Committing any nuisance, throwing paper or rubbish of any kind, using bad language, or being otherwise disorderly or indecent.

(b) Gambling.

(c) Playing games on Sunday.

(d) Removing, injuring, or disfiguring any of the fences, seats, barriers, or other property of any kind.

(e) Damaging any of the trees, shrubs, plants, or flowers, or running on the dug or enclosed ground.

(f) Interference in any way with the playing of games in the spaces on the Recreation Ground specially allotted for that purpose.

- (4) The following acts are prohibited, unless with the sanction of the Trustees:—
- (a) Erecting any booths, photographic apparatus, poles, seats, stands, or other structure in any part of the ground.
 - (b) Drawing or driving any carriage, van, bicycle, or other vehicle except a child's perambulator or invalid's chair.
 - (c) Delivery of any public address, or holding any meeting in any part of the Recreation Ground.
 - (d) Selling any intoxicating liquors, or refreshments of any kind, or offering for sale any other articles.
 - (e) Playing any music.
 - (f) Placing on the ground any horse, ass, or cattle of any kind.
 - (g) Affixing or posting any bill, placard, or notice to or upon any wall or fence in or enclosing the ground, or to or upon any tree, or any fixed or moveable seat, or on any other structure or erection on the ground or belonging thereto.
- (5) No dogs to be admitted unless led.
- (6) Games of all kinds shall only be played in or upon the spaces allotted for any particular game from time to time by the Trustees.
- (7) No person shall enter or quit the ground otherwise than through one of the authorised means of entrance thereto or egress therefrom.
- (8) Any person infringing any of the above Bye-Laws will be liable to be proceeded against according to law, and shall be liable for any such offence to a penalty not exceeding 40s.
- (9) Subject to the approval of the Charity Commissioners the Trustees may alter or amend the foregoing Bye-Laws and make such additional Bye-Laws as they from time to time may deem expedient.
