The church of St. Lawrence is an ancient and spacious edifice of stone in the Perpendicular style, with double nave, south porch, and a tower of Norman with double nave, south porch, and a tower of Norman date, with spire, and containing a clock and 8 bells: there are choir stalls of the 13th century: the church was restored in 1867 at a cost of about £3,600, and a new organ-chamber added: there are five stained windows, one of which, placed in 1884, is a memorial to Louis Leslie M.D.: the church affords 800 sittings, of which even helf are free to Louis Lesite M.D.: the clutch anords soo attemps, of which nearly half are free. The register dates from the year 1615. The living is a vicarage, net yearly value  $\pounds_{183}$ , with residence, in the gift of the Dean and Ohapter of Winchester, and held since 1903 by the Rev. Lancelot Smith M.A. of Trinity College, Cambridge, and chaplain to Alton union. The vicarial rent-charges
