ALTON is a market, union and county court town, parish and railway station on the Farnham and Winchester branch of the London and South Western railway, 47 miles from London by road and rail, 17 north-east from Winchester, 11 south-by-east from Basingstoke and 8½ south-west from Farnham, in the Eastern division of the county, petty sessional division and hundred of Alton, rural deanery of Alton western division and archdeaconry

and diocese of Winchester. The river Wey rises close to the town. The only historical event connected with Alton is the defeat of the Royal forces, under Colonel Boles, by the Parliamentarians, commanded by Sir Wm. Waller, in 1643. This place returned a representative to Parliament in the reign of Edward I. The Local Government Act of 1858 was adopted here August 28, 1860, and the town was governed by a local board until

ALTON is a market, union and county court town,
 parish and railway station on the Farnham and Win-
 chester branch of the London and South Western rail-
 way, 47 miles from London by road and rail, 17 north-
 east from Winchester, 11 south-by-east from Basingstoke
 and 8½ south-west from Farnham, in the Eastern
 division of the county, petty sessional division and
 hundred of Alton, and in the rural deanery of Alton,
 and the archdeaconry and diocese of Winchester. The
 river Wey rises close to the town. The only historical
 event connected with Alton is the defeat of the Royal
 forces, under Colonel Boles, by the Parliamentarians,
 commanded by Sir William Waller, in 1643. This place
 returned a representative to Parliament in the reign of
 Edward I. The "Local Government Act of 1858" was
 adopted here August 28, 1860, but under the provisions
 of the "Local Government Act" (56 and 57 Vict. c. 73)
 the town is now governed by an Urban District Council
 of 12 members. Works on the south side of the town
 for obtaining a supply of water for the town were com-
 menced in May, 1876, and completed at a cost of £6,000,

under the direction of Messrs. Gotto and Beesley, of
 George street, Westminster: the water is obtained from
 a well sunk 140 feet into the lower chalk and bored 403
 feet, total depth 547 feet; the supply is constant, and
 hydrants are fixed at short distances in case of fire:
 the town is lighted with gas supplied by a private
 company. The church of St. Lawrence is an ancient
 and spacious edifice of stone in the Perpendicular style,
 with double nave, south porch, and a tower of Norman
 date, with spire, and containing a clock and 8 bells:
 there are choir stalls of the 13th century: the church
 was restored in 1867 at a cost of about £3,600, and a
 new organ-chamber added: there are five stained
 windows, one of which, placed in 1884, is a memorial
 to Louis Leslie M.D.: the church affords 800 sittings,
 of which nearly half are free. The register dates from
 the year 1615. The living is a vicarage, net yearly
 value £183, with residence, in the gift of the Dean and
 Chapter of Winchester, and held since 1903 by the Rev.
 Lancelot Smith M.A. of Trinity College, Cambridge,
 and chaplain to Alton union. The vicarial rent-charges
